# State Route 32 Widening Project (Phase 1) Weekly Update

### Introduction

### Update Notice of Ongoing Activities

As a result of the recent clear and dry weather, work has continued once again on some of the roadway and pedestrian improvements, as well as the traffic signal modifications. Currently, pedestrian improvements to the sidewalk and sidewalk ramps have now been constructed on the south side of the Forest Avenue and SR32 intersection. This work reconfigures the sidewalk and access points to crosswalks, which will allow for better transitions at this intersection. New traffic signals have also been installed in order to meet the new ultimate alignment of SR32 and Forest Avenue. While traffic signal work at this intersection continues this week, pedestrians and bicyclists should exercise caution in following designated paths of travel and avoiding areas of temporary, active construction. Over the next few weeks, minor work will continue at the Dead Horse Slough Bridge and the Forest Avenue intersection. Weather permitting, it appears that the sound wall construction and final roadway items will resume in the middle part of March. We appreciate your patience throughout the life of the project and please feel free to contact us if you have any questions or concerns.

### Safety Tips

- ✓ Drive slowly and carefully through the construction area.
- ✓ Be alert for construction workers and large equipment, such as backhoes, graders and trucks.
- ✓ Obey all construction signs and directions from traffic control flaggers.


