The procedural requirements as set forth in California Vehicle Code Section 35795, including notice and public hearing, must be followed when amending fees contained in Section III.C.

### I. HOURLY FEES

- A. All hourly fees set forth herein shall have a minimum fee of one hour.
- B. For work in excess of one hour, the fee shall be prorated for each half hour or portion thereof. (EXAMPLE: For work which takes one hour and ten minutes, the fee would be 1½ times the hourly rate.)

### II. PLAN CHECK, INSPECTION AND/OR ENGINEERING FEES FOR WORK NOT COVERED IN THE FOLLOWING FEE SCHEDULE (Subject to Government Code §§66016-66018.)

- A. Basic Fee \$113.50/hour
- B. Overtime Fee \$141.00/hour

When staff is requested by applicant to work overtime to complete plan checking and/or inspections (subject to prior approval and availability of staff).

- C. Marking/Annotating - additional sets of plans at the request of contractors, subcontractors, developers, engineers, etc. \$3.50/sheet  
(maximum \$53.50 per set)

- D. Construction Inspection Fee - to cover the costs incurred in responding to more than two requests for inspection at a construction site to inspect the same work item. \$139.00/inspection

III. PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY FEES (ENCROACHMENT PERMIT)

An encroachment permit shall be required for the following public right of way uses:

A. Building Materials - Placing in Public Right of Way

All persons desiring a permit to place, or to cause to be placed, on any street, sidewalk, or public place in the City any material, machinery, or apparatus (including dumpsters) for building, paving, or other purposes or any obstruction shall pay the following Permit Processing fee upon application therefor: \$14.00

B. Utility Service Installation (Subject to Government Code §§66016-66018.)

- 1. Annual Encroachment Permit No Fee

For maintenance of existing utility-owned facilities in the public right-of-way which do not require removal or installation of public improvements (pavement, curb, gutter, sidewalk, driveway).

- 2. Minor Encroachment \$123.00

For installation or improvement of service to single lots which requires excavation in the public right-of-way improvements, with the exception of dirt parkways and behind sidewalks.

- 3. Major Encroachment \$1,421.00

For installation of multiple services and/or main distribution lines which require excavation in public right-of-way improvements, including dirt parkways and behind sidewalks.

C. Transportation Permit for Overwidth, Overheight, Overlength, Etc. (Subject to California Vehicle Code §35795.)

- 1. Single Trip Permit \$16.00/each
- 2. Annual Permit \$90.00/each

D. Metered Parking Space - Temporary Use

All persons desiring a permit to use a City of Chico metered parking space on a temporary basis shall pay the following processing fee (excluding Saturdays, Sundays and holidays) \$14.00 plus \$20.00/space/day



C. Parking Benefit Area (In-lieu) Fees (previously in Fee Schedule 15.090 - Parking Fees and Rates) (Adjust per ENR.)

The following fee shall be paid in lieu of providing off-street parking facilities (as required by the applicable provisions of Title 19 of the Chico Municipal Code) within the "IN-LIEU PARKING BENEFIT AREA" pursuant to Section 19.70.050 of the Code:

Fee per parking space not provided: **Fee temporarily suspended pending adoption of the 2030 General Plan.**

(Example: If the Code requires that 25 off-street parking spaces be provided, and the site can only accommodate 15 spaces, the developer would pay an in-lieu fee of \$16,000 x 10 spaces = \$160,000.)

V. RENTAL OF CITY-OWNED EQUIPMENT AND PERSONNEL

**I. GRANTS OF LICENSE**

Except as set forth herein, all persons making application for a grant of license from the City of Chico shall pay the following fee: \$2,097.00

The purpose of this fee is to reimburse the City for certain costs incurred in the processing of grants of license applications including, but not limited to, the preparation of all legal documents and staff processing time.

**II. RECORDATION OF GRANT OF LICENSE**

In conjunction with the execution of the Grant of License, the Licensee shall, if applicable, submit payment of recording fees in conformance with the current Butte County Recorder's fee schedule.

**III. EXEMPTIONS FROM FEE PAYMENT**

Licensees who have been granted permission by resolution of the City Council, or pursuant to Section 14R.28.010 of the Chico Municipal Code, to install facilities in the public right of way, where such facilities are installed solely at the expense of the licensee and when said resolution provides that the City shall receive a portion of the revenues produced by such facilities, shall be exempt from the payment of the fee set forth above in consideration of such revenues.

#### B. Final Map

A map prepared by a subdivider in compliance with Chapter 18.24 of the Chico Municipal Code.

#### C. Improvement Plans and Specifications

Drawings, specifications and estimates of cost for the proposed construction of improvements required as a condition of subdivision tentative map approval and Title 18 of the Chico Municipal Code.

#### D. Planned Development Subdivision

A subdivision where development has been approved pursuant to Chapter 19.28 of the Chico Municipal Code.

#### E. Subdivision

As defined in Section 66424 of the Subdivision Map Act, as amended, and Section 18.04.050 of the Chico Municipal Code.

I. **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this fee is to reimburse the City for costs incurred in processing a notice of intention to file a petition to establish a maintenance assessment district not as a condition of a subdivision approval, and any subsequent petition to modify a district, including costs incurred by the City Clerk’s Office, City’s Engineering Division, and other City Departments. The total fees set forth herein shall not exceed the actual amount of costs incurred by the City.

II. **INITIAL FILING DEPOSIT** \$1,724.00

Prior to filing a petition to establish or modify a maintenance assessment district, the person or persons proposing to circulate and/or file such petition shall file a notice of intention to file a property owner petition with the City Clerk. Such notice of intention shall be accompanied by the above filing deposit.

III. **ADDITIONAL DEPOSITS** (to be paid in increments of): \$291.00

Additional amount to be deposited in the event the initial filing deposit is insufficient to pay the total amount of costs incurred by the City.

IV. **REFUND OF EXCESS DEPOSIT**

Upon conclusion of the formation of the maintenance assessment district, any funds deposited in excess of actual costs incurred by City shall be refunded to petitioner within 60 days following formation of the district.

- B. The unit cost of any item not listed above shall be determined by the Building and Development Services Director.
- C. The Building and Development Services Director may reduce the unit costs set forth above in his/her discretion if the size of the project or other factor or factors indicate that a lesser amount is warranted. In addition, the Director may consider estimates of cost provided to him/her by a contractor licensed to install improvements, or by engineers or architects who have consulted with such contractors, in establishing unit costs below those set forth above.
- D. Any determination made hereunder by the Building and Development Services Director shall be subject to appeal in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 2.60 of the Chico Municipal Code.

**I. VACATION AND/OR ABANDONMENT FEES**

- A. All persons applying for vacation and/or abandonment of a street, public service easement or public right of way by the City of Chico shall pay the following fee to reimburse the City for certain costs incurred in the processing of vacation and/or abandonment petitions including, but not limited to, the preparation of all legal documents, newspaper publication of notices and staff processing time: \$1,974.00

**Note:** This fee does not cover costs to be incurred by the petitioner for the title reports, preparation of plats, legal descriptions (which plats and descriptions shall be prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Engineering Division) and the securing of letters from utility companies.

- B. The “abandonment” of abutter’s rights of access is accomplished by conveyance of a Grant of Access Easement from the City to the adjacent owner rather than by the normal abandonment process. To reimburse the City for certain costs incurred in processing the Grant of Access Easement the following fee will be charged: \$144.00

**Note:** In addition to this processing fee, the owner shall submit payment of recording fees in conformance with the current Butte County Recorder’s fee schedule.
