Acceptable & Unacceptable Materials

for Recycling & Garbage Collection

- ✓ Acceptable items
- O Unacceptable items

Recycling Container

METAL - Acceptable Items:

- ✓ Aluminum cans
- ✓ Tin/steel food & beverage cans (please rinse labels okay)

METAL - Unacceptable Items:

- Aerosol cans
- O Pots & pans
- S Foil
- ♦ Scrap metal
- O Paint cans or other household hazardous waste containers

PAPER - Acceptable Items:

Most clean & dry household paper, such as:

- ✓ Newspaper
- ✓ Cardboard (bundle larger pieces & place next to container)
- ✓ Magazines & phone books
- ✓ Computer paper
- ✓ Junk mail & catalogs
- ✓ Food boxes (cereal, cracker, etc.)
- ✓ Envelopes (including plastic window types)

PAPER - Unacceptable Items:

- Milk cartons & other waxed paper
- O Plates, cups, paper or cardboard contaminated with food

GLASS - Acceptable Items:

✓ All colors of glass beverage & food containers (Please rinse & remove lids)

GLASS - Unacceptable Items:

- O Ceramics, Pyrex, porcelain, or other dishware
- Mirrors or window glass
- **♦** Light bulbs or stemware

PLASTICS - Acceptable Items:

- ✓ All plastic rigid containers with the 1-7 recycling symbol, including:
- ✓ Soft drink & water bottles
- ✓ · Milk & juice jugs
- ✓ Yogurt, margarine, & other food containers
- ✓ Shampoo, detergent, & other household bottles

(Please rinse & remove lids)

PLASTICS - Unacceptable Items:

- O Plastic bags or wrap
- Styrofoam/polystyrene containers & peanuts
- Noys, furniture, flower pots, & syringes
- S Five-gallon buckets

Garbage Container

Acceptable Items:

✓ Household garbage

Unacceptable Items:

- Not ashes or coals
- O Dirt, sod, rocks, or concrete
- O Construction or demolition debris
- Heavy metal items (such as auto parts)
- S Toxic, flammable, or other hazardous materials
- Syringes or "sharps" (unless properly contained & labeled)
- O Televisions & computer monitors

Household Hazardous Waste

Paint, motor oil, antifreeze, batteries, gasoline, some household cleaners, or anything that is labeled with the words "Caution", "Warning", "Danger" or "Poison" are considered to be household hazardous waste and cannot be thrown away in the trash containers, poured into the storm drain, or dumped on the ground.

These materials should be taken to the Butte County Regional Household Hazardous Waste Facility located at 1101 Marauder Street in the Chico Municipal Airport Area (behind A/C Industrial Services). The facility is free to Butte County residents and is open Fridays and Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. For more information call 1-866-429-2288.
