Chico, CA – (January 3, 2023) – The National Weather Service warns of heavy rainfall over the next several days. "With severe weather forecasted for the region, the City of Chico is prepared to respond to storm-related issues throughout the community," stated City Manager, Mark Sorensen.

Immediate Infrastructure Needs:

• To report street flooding, downed tree limbs in the right-of-way, or other immediate infrastructure issues, please call Public Works Operations & Maintenance at (530) 894-4200 during business hours, 8:00am-5:00pm. **After 5:00pm**, please call the Chico Police Department's non-emergency line at (530) 897-4900.
