Subsurface testing revealed a lack of significant stratigraphy with all cultural materials confined to the initial 15 cmbs. Cultural materials showed no significant horizontal differentiation. Chronologically sensitive artifacts indicated at *terminus post quem* of 1929. However, the presence of modern debris provided evidence of modern disturbance to the deposit.

Given the great horizontal extent of the site, the lack of depth for the deposit, and the high degree of fragmentation of the recovered materials, it is most likely that SR32-1 represents a secondary deposit related to the construction of SR 32. The cultural materials present at SR32-1 were most likely originally associated with CA-BUT-1387/H (Mulkey Ranch) located to the south of SR 32. The homogenization of the deposit as a result of construction has significantly reduced the potential for the data to address research questions. The deposit does not maintain a significant potential to yield information concerning activities that occurred at this location during a discrete period of time.

SR32-2 is an earthen ditch that extends north from SR 32 to empty into Dead Horse Slough. The ditch begins at a modern culvert that crosses under SR 32, but the ditch does not continue to the south of SR 32. A less developed ditch exists to the south of SR 32 and drains the adjacent fields through the culvert that eventually empties into SR32-2. At SR 32, the ditch is approximately four meters wide and two meters in depth. As the ditch progresses to the north, it becomes shallower and less developed. By its outlet at Dead Horse Slough, the ditch is no longer visible on the landscape. The construction of SR32-2 may be associated with the construction of a sewer line that parallels the ditch to the east and has created a berm. The soil that formed the berm appears to have originated from the ditch.

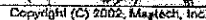

What is the Project?

The City of Chico, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the Butte County Association of Governments (BCAG) are hosting a public information workshop to discuss the proposed State Route 32 Widening Project. The proposed project would widen and improve approximately 2.6 miles of State Route 32 between State Route 99 and Yosemite Drive. The purpose of the proposed project is to accommodate additional capacity needed as a result of approved and planned development adjacent to the State Route 32 corridor. Construction of the project is tentatively scheduled for 2008/2009, depending on funding and environmental review. The project is being sponsored by the City of Chico which intends to construct the proposed project using only local funds; no state or federal funds are anticipated. Design and construction of the project is being coordinated with Caltrans and BCAG.

What Improvements are being Considered?

The City, Caltrans and BCAG are considering the following improvements which may be phased depending on funding:

- Construct two new westbound travel lanes primarily north of the existing roadway to convert State Route 32 from two to four lanes.
- Construct a new bridge over Dead Horse Slough and modify the existing culvert over the South Fork of Dead Horse Slough.
- Construct intersection improvements at Fir Street, Forest Avenue, El Monte Avenue, Bruce Road and Yosemite Drive including traffic signals at Fir Street and Yosemite Drive and signal improvements at all intersections.
- Improve the State Route 99 on-ramps and off-ramps; the identified improvements at the interchange are consistent and compatible with the recently approved State Route 99 Auxiliary Lane Project.

Over →

- Modify Fir Street to provide one-way (northbound) movement only between westbound State Route 32 and eastbound State Route 32 only.
- The project would be constructed using noise-reducing pavement (rubberized asphalt concrete).

What Has Been Done so far, and What are the Next Steps?

The following technical studies are now underway: traffic, air quality, noise, biological resources (including trees, wetlands and special-status species including Butte County Meadowfoam), cultural resources, water resources/drainage, and hazardous materials. Once these studies are complete, the City will prepare the draft environmental document, which will be circulated for public review in late 2006. The document will be available for public comment for a minimum of 30 days, after which a public hearing will be held by the City to receive community input. At this time, it is anticipated the project will be processed under the California Environmental Quality Act with an Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration.

What is the Workshop Objective?

The meeting's objective is to review the proposed project and give the public the opportunity to ask questions and provide comments on the proposed project. A public roster of open house attendees will be developed. Comment cards will be available at the meeting for providing written comments. Residents and businesses in the project area are strongly encouraged to attend this information workshop.
