3. What types of incentives should be used to encourage the incorporation of sustainability principles in new and existing development?

4. What criteria or factors should the City explore to encourage a land use plan that is fiscally viable and economically sustainable?

5. What are your top three concerns related to “sustainability” and how should they be addressed in the General Plan?
 - a. What challenges or obstacles to implementation do you think we should anticipate?
