

Chico deserves an experienced, professional councilmember who will ensure the City continues providing critical services like police and fire protection, parks, and environmental protections.

Randall Stone owns and operates a professional financial management firm for the last 12 years; was an affordable housing advocate for 8-years; director of Special Olympics Butte County for 8-years; and serves as President of the League of California Cities (Sacramento Valley Division) – recognized statewide for his leadership on behalf of Chico at the local, regional, and state level.

Councilmember Stone spearheaded efforts to reduce City costs – returning over \$4 million in employee concessions over 3-years to the General Fund and returning the City to fiscal solvency. Stone pledged to enact pension reform and budget accountability delivering on that promise – holding staff accountable to the people.

Councilmember Stone fought for neighbors' rights against forced annexation; proactively reduced administrative expenses proposing partnerships with the Sheriff in our Parks – keeping Caper Acres open; demanded strong campaign finance disclosure policies; fought to keep the Saturday Farmers Market downtown; and saved the Esplanade enhancing pedestrian and bicycle safety to keep our kids safe. A 22-year resident of Chico, Randall (43) and Krista (38) are raising their son Rhys (3).
